

ABSTRACT

Micro Waqf Bank (BWM) is one of the cash waqf management institutions under the auspices of Islamic boarding schools which plays a role in providing financing as well as training and assistance to micro business actors in the area. This research aims to analyze the role of BWM in community empowerment in terms of whether there are differences in income and profits obtained by BWM customers between before obtaining financing capital from the Micro Waqf Bank and after obtaining financing capital from the Micro Waqf Bank. The method used is a quantitative approach using descriptive analysis techniques and using SPSS 25. The data used is primary data from questionnaires distributed to Micro Waqf Bank customers using purposive sampling techniques. The results of this research show that the provision of capital by the Micro Waqf Bank has been effective in increasing the income and profits of micro business customers of the Micro Waqf Bank, thereby supporting operations and enabling them to run their businesses more profitably.
