

ABSTRACT

This study aims to analyze the factors influencing the performance of stunting budget implementation in Klaten Regency in 2023. Stunting has become one of the main priorities for the Indonesian government due to its significant impact on human resource quality and long-term economic growth. Local governments, including Klaten Regency, have allocated special budgets through the Special Allocation Fund (DAK) to support stunting reduction programs. The variables used in this study are human resource (HR) quality, stunting budgeting effectiveness, and organizational commitment as independent variables, with the effectiveness of stunting budget realization as the dependent variable.

This research adopts a quantitative approach using secondary data analysis. The sample consists of 34 community health centers (puskesmas) in Klaten Regency. The results, obtained through multiple linear regression analysis, show that HR quality and organizational commitment have a positive and significant effect on the effectiveness of stunting budget realization, while budgeting effectiveness does not have a significant effect. These findings indicate the importance of improving human resource capacity and strengthening organizational commitment to support the success of stunting programs, as well as the need for a thorough evaluation of the budgeting system to enhance its impact on program realization.
