

ABSTRACT

The high unemployment rate in Indonesia, including among university graduates, indicates the urgency of enhancing entrepreneurial intention to foster the creation of new job opportunities. One way to develop entrepreneurial intention is through entrepreneurship education. This study aims to analyze the influence of entrepreneurship education on entrepreneurial intention, with internal locus of control as an intervening variable.

The population in this study consists of students from the Faculty of Economics and Business, Diponegoro University. The sampling technique used is non-random sampling with an accidental sampling method. The sample includes students who have completed the Entrepreneurship Education course. Data were collected using questionnaires and analyzed using the Partial Least Squares (PLS) method.

The results indicate that entrepreneurship education has a positive and significant effect on entrepreneurial intention. Additionally, entrepreneurship education influences internal locus of control, which in turn significantly affects entrepreneurial intention. These findings underscore the importance of providing entrepreneurship education and strengthening internal locus of control as efforts to enhance entrepreneurial intention.
